I would like to let you know a little of what will be happening between now and the session in April. We will be asking each group discipline (ie. Rapier, Heavy, Artisans, etc.) to help choose what instructors you would like to have brought up to Avacal to teach and what types of classes you would like to have during this session. We are also asking each discipline to help fundraise to bring these instructors into Avacal to teach. Please know that it will take approximately \$500 to fly an instructor into Avacal. This is why we are asking for help to fundraise. You should also know that if your discipline group raises funds, the funds will go towards YOUR choice of instructor first.

Getting Medieval Taking It Up a Notch

Are you a medieval re-enactor who wants to get beyond basics? Are you ready to test your sewing skills? Are you ready to spend a little cash? Do you want to look like a professional re-enactor at the Tower of London? Here are some things that you can do to look more impressive and wow your fellow re-enactors.

As a newcomer to the SCA, I am not new to medieval history. Having read dozens of books the past few years, and eager to accumulate some gear...I have been forced to learn many new skills with my hands since I have a family, and money is scarce. In the Medieval Age, they had lots of time, and little money...so they learned skills during the cold

winter months to prepare them for the next year. I initially got involved to be a fighter. But you only fight so much, and then there's the archery, feasting, drinking, and socializing!

I have had to become a jack of all trades – a fighter/archer, an armourer, carpenter, leatherworker, seamstress, brewer/meadmaker/winemaker, musician, chandler, bowyer, and historian.

As a newcomer to Quad War last year, one of the very first things I noticed was the lack of medieval footwear, nice outfits, but a serious eyesore for me were the running shoes. I understand the expense of buying footwear on the internet, but there is no greater feeling than wearing period footwear while in costume and something as simple as a moccasin would do the trick. It is worth saving for, but there is a simple way to make your own turnshoe, and you can have it done in a day!

Wooden Pattens (shoes) are also head-turners, and actually are quite easy to make (even without prior wood- and leather-working skills - I have been wanting to make a pair for a while now. It was very common to wear them outside, especially in the city streets that were always muddy and full of all kinds of animals parts, rats, urine, and garbage. They kept you up and off the ground a bit better than leather.

As for costuming, I saw some good outfits, and some bad ones. Trim and edging played an important role in the nobility. Layers also - the more layers, the richer you were. As far as fabrics and seams go, when making your outfits, try to avoid showing clips and seams use buttons and invisible seams. When it

comes to fabrics wait for a sale at Fabricland and buy linen. The beauty of linen is it looks fabulous on, and its cool to wear in the summe and its authentic and believe me - people notice. The first person I met on my wanderings at Quad last year, remarked immediately on the simple outfit I was wearing and said I should be a poster child for the SCA – It felt good, but the point is, they noticed the difference right away!

While we are on the subject of clothing, this is for the men folk as women's underwear should never be seen - Braies can be bought or made fairly easily. Hosen is much more difficult to make, but there are several places online which sell it. These two items put together make a world of difference to a man's appearance. Even dressed casually around camp, a man looks impressive even in his underwear if he has all the details right; he looks more medieval than someone wearing a very expensive houpplande over a pair of modern pants.

One more thing about costumes that often gets missed. Many nobles I saw at Quad War were topless and I do not mean the wenches - I mean no hats or Iiripipes. You would never have worked or played without a head covering in the 14th century, and does it ever complete your outfit. It is extremely easy to make a hat and a pattern for a liripipe is easy to find. My wife will be selling a few at Quad this year.

Other easy to fix costuming I noticed were eyeglasses, hair styles, belts, pouches, surcottes, embellishments, and jewelry.

While I wear eyeglasses mundanely, I religiously crack open the old contact lens case every time I put on my medieval clothing. Nothing ruins a perfect outfit like modern eyewear. Sunglasses are even worse; most people do not need sunglasses for medical/sight reasons. To me, they're akin to wearing tennis shoes while in costume. If the sun bothers you, wear a hat or hood—that's how medieval people kept the sun out of their eyes.

Everyone by now should know about Value Village and Goodwill for accessorizing, but with a little effort you can find just the right necklace/ring/embroidery to assist you in living up to your personae online. I use ebay for rampant lions and thistles.

Belts and pouches are so easy to make and decorate. With a little research, personalizing a belt can be very rewarding. Tandy leather is my haunt and it should be yours. It is worth not visiting coffee houses and fast food joints for a week to save enough for a shoulder of veg-tan to make a few belts and pouches.

Hair styles. For women, it may not seem important, but even learning some braids, adding a flower, using a covering woven into the hairs with a clip, buying hair extensions with braids improves the medieval look. For men, growing in long hair, buying a wig (for certain events), wearing a beard and/or braiding it makes all the difference. I know I get a lot of looks in my job for having long hair and a long goatee but it also gives me many opportunities throughout the day to discuss my "hobbies" and invite people to join me at the next feast, and many of them do!

My name is Donald of St. Andrews. My personae is very detailed and I can spin a yarn for an hour of my fictional life in the 14th century. I am of Irish descent, moved to Scotland to become a monk, since I was a third child I became a brewer of meads instead. Had to learn to fight to protect our enclave, since we were a small group, and we had to learn to help out each other in whatever gifts God graced us with. We were self sufficient, and we could serve the kingdom whenever called to do so. When you look at me,

you will see someone dressed as perfectly as a 14th century noble can be, and it makes me feel like I am for a time.

There is no good reason, if you love the SCA, that you cannot do the same with very little expense over the next year. I promise the kingdom, I will be offering my time and services in free workshops (material costs only) on history (personae, geography, guilds, etc.), bow-making (make a yew bow or crossbow), leather making (belts, pouches, mugs, sachels, shoes), chandlery (candles and waterproofing), brewing (meads, wines, beer), and carpentry (everyone should have a wooden chest or 2 (get rid of the Rubbermaid folks)). Thank you for inviting me into the fold, I still have much to learn, but I am so looking forward to sharing, working, and playing amongst you all after Quad War.










Festival of Trees 2012











We are now coming down to the last few months before all the ornaments have to be completed for our tree. We will only have 3 more Taverns and A&S Nights (September, October and November) to work on any ornaments as a large group.

During the month of August I am hoping to have time to design some simple Christmas tree ornaments using Quilling as the Tecnique in the construction. If all goes as plan, then I will have a couple of different designs for people to try and make during September's Tavern. If you want to learn on how to Quill, then this would be something that would give you a taste of what it is all about. I am hoping to have enough materials and Quilling tools so that up to 12 people can give this unusual craft a try.

I still need anyone who is planning of participating in this group project to let me know that you are interested, and what you are planning on crafting.

The main focus for ornaments this year will be different headwear throughout the ages. This will include helms, fabric hats, hoods, and anything else that you can think of that was worn on the head.

This year we are trying to stick with a colour scenario also. Red and white will be the predominant colours of the ornaments. This will allow for the ornaments to be blocked in groups and swurled up the tree to the top, hopefully resembling a enormous peppermint.

We are still in need of someone, or a small group, to take on the challenge of creating a custom tree skirt to go along with our entry. If no one is interested, then I do have a alittery felt kind of covering that we could use.

We will be decorating the tree down at the Shaw Conference Centre on Monday November 26th, In past years everyone has worn some kind of Christmas hat to add to the general spirit of merriment, much to the delight of the other festival workers and designers.

We will try to have a working table at the A&S tent (depends on space) so you can come by and get some things to work on, chat, or just drop off your largesse donations.

I will have tags with me for those who have not tagged their largesse - Their Excellencies will be trading these gifts far and wide, and want to help spread your wordfame! Tagging gifts also tells people that you are helping the society in your own way.

If you can't make largesse while at Quad, but still want to contribute, we will gladly take your largesse over the course of the reign! Their Excellencies will be giving away a lot of

largesse over the next 6 months, and will constantly need a supply to hand out. So if you donate a little bit later in the winter, that is A-OK!

So what kind of largesse are TE Wernar and Sina looking for? Basically, they want things that will enhance the flavour and look of our game. Please use natural materials (wood, linen, leather, cotton, etc) in all your largesse. Some ideas include:

- Woven Trim
- Leather pouches
- spindles
- Pottery

It will turn West (right) midway through town. Go 5 km West of (past) Marsden, turn North (right) on Artland Road. The site is 4.5 km to the West (left).


Directions to Site:
