

The Black Rose Won by Local Archer



Not many people outside of Archery know of a prize called the Black Rose.

This is an award of recognition for the archers, and was started in the Barony of Montengarde. It is a year long tournament that is open to all levels of archers. Throughout the year, archers participate in tournaments in their respective category - beginner, intermediate, veteran or master bowman. If you win the tournament in your category, you are awarded a black ribbon. At the end of the year, these ribbons are added up, and the person with the most black ribbons wins the year long Black Rose Tournament.

Through many hours of practice, and many tournaments, our own Grioffa won the recognition of the Black Rose. She was in the running for the honour with Argent of Montengarde as they both had the same number of black ribbons for their respective categories. This forced a shoot-off between the two archers.

The shoot-off consisted of a challenge of six arrows. The two finalists were to shoot at a target that featured a drawn slit in the middle of a group of trees and bears. The object of the challenge was to get as many arrows within the narrow slitted area, missing the bears and trees. Argent had a cluster of arrows, while Grioffa had five of her arrows in the desired area of the target, all in a row. For an impressive showing of Archery skill, Grioffa was awarded the Black Rose for 2008.

FAMILY DAY DEMO

Again this year, the Barony participated in the Mill Woods Family Day Mediaeval Days. This was our third year participating, and it continues to grow and get better. This year the visual element was further enlarged with the aric being decorated with members' devices. We also had a great many more displays showcasing the various activities that people participate in. Guillaine set up a calligraphy and illumination table, and crafted some keepsakes for the kids by making bookmarks that featured the children's names in Old English Calligraphy.

The Borealis Musicians set up a large display of instruments and information and spent the afternoon answering questions and playing for everyone. There was a big display with a number of different pieces of garb and embroidery in addition to the many other displays highlighting the other group interests - Musical, Heavy, Rapier, Archery, and a general information display. Again this year, the archers ran a "Archery Lane" where the kids could try shooting plastic arrows at a target. This was quite popular with a great lineup for most of the day.

Cath ran a dance segment that showed off the intricate steps of many of the period dances. She also filled the aric to overflowing with many of the members joining the general public in doing a couple of fun dances that were easy to learn and join in. It sure is an impressive site seeing heavies in armour, Rapiers in with their hats, and our other members in their fancy garb kicking up their heels and showing off all their footwork.


This day was again a success for our little barony as we have had a few people from the demo come out to a few practices and connect with our group.
