The new location for the CRAC will be opening on Tuesday May 15, 2012.

The new location is at 5618 - 76 Ave, Edmonton.

Aers Entry? Where Do I Start??

It all starts with an idea.... something which interests you and which you might like to add to your SCA "stuff". Let's say you want something for your encampment.... maybe a table or chair? Sure, a chair sounds good let's start with that.

Now, ask yourself if the chair you have in mind would have existed in period. Nope, a fancy cover for a modern "director's chair" will not do. But a director's chair has one nice feature: it folds up small for travel. Did medieval travelers have collapsible chairs? Did they bring their furniture with them when traveling or did they improvise with what was available when they set up camp? Hmmm... that might depend on the importance of the traveler and on where and when he traveled.

This is also the time to consider what resources are available. There may be pictures of later-period chairs: illustrations in manuscripts or paintings or even photographs of extant chairs. Early-period chairs are harder to research directly but you might be able to infer how they were constructed if you studied the tools, materials and construction methods which were available. Please don't try to make something first and document it later -- that only leads to frustration and disappointment.

Email the A&S Champion and the Minister of A&S to tell them you're planning to enter the competition. If things just don't come together you can withdraw later (although we hope that won't be necessary).

Gather the materials and tools, and try making a chair. If the materials are expensive you might first make a prototype out of cheaper material. Keep a record of every step in the construction. Take pictures! If the project doesn't work out as expected, that's OK. Learn from your mistakes. With luck you'll have enough time and materials to do it again.

Write a rough draft of your documentation. This is the scary part for most people but it's not really so difficult. Here is a format which generally works well:

INTRODUCTION Tell what the object is, who might have used such an object, and where, when, and why. **Include** references and pictures to support your assertions.

BODY Tell how you went about making the object, stepby-step. Include photos of various stages of construction if that helps your explanation. If possible, include references to prove you made the object the "right" way. Also tell if you made any significant changes from the way things would have been done in period and why, e.g. using a cheaper material because authentic materials would be too expensive or using power tools to save time.

CONCLUSION Tell what you learned from making this object, how "authentic" you believe the object is, and what you would do different if you had to do it over.

BIBLIOGRAPHY List your references

There are other ways to organize the documentation which are also effective. Watch for information about a documentation class to be taught soon.

Proofread the draft or ask someone else to proofread it for you. If you need help citing your references don't be afraid to ask! The final copy should be easy to read in about 5 10 minutes (usually about 5 10 pages). Make at least 3 copies of your documentation so each judge can look through a copy.

Give some thought to how the object will be presented. You will have some table space to display the object. Do you need a backboard to display information? A tablecloth? Some accessories, or tools, or patterns? If you've put a lot of effort into making and documenting the object then you want to display it in an attractive manner so more people will come by to see what you've done.

Imagine the questions the judges might ask you and think how you might answer them. "I don't know but I'll try to find out" can be a satisfactory answer. If the judges ask you to talk about your entry be enthusiastic about what you've learned. Remember, the judges don't know everything they actually enjoy learning from you!

If you are competing for the A&S Championship, repeat the foregoing steps several times. Be sure to send your letter of intent to the Baron and Baroness also. Find out what is expected of a Champion of Borealis, just in case!

Have fun preparing and discussing your entries!

In Service to Avacal

Each year the Barony of Borealis chooses new champions to represent the heavy fighters, the rapier fighters, the archers and the artisans of our barony. This year we are also looking into the possibility of choosing a bardic champion.

The competitions for the Heavy Champion and the Rapier Champion get a lot of attention. The populace enjoys watching these tournaments as the noise of combat and cheering attracts passer-bys. The competition for Archery Champion is usually harder to find because the shooting must happen in a safe area far away from other activities. Spectators are welcome at the archery range if they stay well back.

The competition for Arts and Sciences (A&S)
Champion usually happens indoors, in a quiet corner where display tables are set up. It's easy to overlook, especially because talkative spectators are unwelcome during judging sessions. However, people are strongly encouraged to walk by and look at the displays, and to ask questions of the entrants when they are not surrounded by judges.

If there is a competition for Bardic Champion it also will be in a quiet, out-of-the-way place. Again, spectators would be welcome if they do not distract the performers.

The names of the new Baronial Champions will be announced during the evening court at Silverwolf. The champions will receive regalia which they are encouraged to wear and/or carry at Baronial events. They are asked to attend the Baron and Baroness during court. They do not have to pay a site fee at Baronial events (Yule Feast, Winter War and the next Silverwolf) although they do have to pay for feasts.

The duties of the champions vary, but they are encouraged to promote their area of expertise. They are involved in creating scenarios/competitions at Winter War and the A&S Champion also helps to organize an activity at Yule Feast. At the end of their year as Champion, each one is expected to organize the competition to choose their successor, with the help of their respective Baronial Officer.

Anyone who has been a Baronial Champion will tell you that it's a really positive experience. It's also an excellent preparation for entering championship competitions at the principality or kingdom level. Why not give it a try this year?

T Need Content! By Yamadi

The Baroney of Borealis Arts & Sciences Championship Rules for 2012

Silverwolf is a little over a month and a half away, and at that time I will hold a competition to choose my successor as Arts and Sciences Champion of Borealis. It's been a honour and a privilege to hold this position, but the rules state it is time for me to pass on this mantle.

As I announced at the beginning of April, we are now taking letters of intent to enter the full competition at Silverwolf. Letters are due no later than May 15 to give us time to find judges and prepare for this competition.

A full entry is a minimum of 3 items, where no more than 2 of the items can be part of the same piece (embroidery on a tunic and a tunic's construction can be two separate items). Each item must have documentation.

We also have room for those who wish to enter a single entry for feedback from either the youth or adult categories (6-17 or 18 and up). Again you must submit a letter by May 15 so we can make sure we have judges for everyone's entries.

Please look below for more information about the rules of the competition and for the email addresses of those who you need to send your Letter of Intent to, I know our barony has some amazing artisans, so please enter!

BOREALIS A&S CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION

The competition to choose a new Baronial Arts and Sciences Champion is held at Silverwolf each year.

Those who want to compete for the championship must have a minimum of three entries. A fourth entry is permitted. All entries will be displayed and judged. The scores of the best three entries will be counted toward the total score.

A Championship competitor **must be a resident of Borealis** and must have a **valid SCA membership**. The winner is expected to maintain his/her membership during their tenure as Champion.

A&S Championship competitors may not compete for other Championship at Silverwolf (i.e. one person may not hold two Baronial Championships at the same time).

Those who do not want to compete for the championship may bring one or two single entries to be displayed and judged.

Each entry must have documentation to accompany it.

A maximum of two entries may be assigned to one item (e.g. a tunic and the embroidery on that tunic) but each entry must have its own documentation.

The entries should be "new" entries. They should not have been entered in another competition and they should have been completed within the past 12 months. The only exception: an item which was entered in a Silverwolf competition one or two years ago may be re-entered if there has been significant change in the item itself or the documentation accompanying it.

Entries can include; sewing, weaving, embroidery, woodworking, metalwork, leatherwork, calligraphy, illumination, cooking/baking, brewing, etc. anything that is an art or science activity which was practiced between 500 AD and 1600 AD in Europe or in an area which had contact with Europe. Bardic entries (storytelling, singing, drama, etc.) will also be permitted this year (may change in future years).

Championship entrants must send a formal declaration of intent to the Baron and Baroness, the current Baronial A&S Champion and the Baronial A&S officer no later than May 15. Single entrants must inform the A&S Champion and the A&S officer of their intention no later than May 15.

There should be a very brief description of each entry (e.g. "Saxon oil lamp" or "Elizabethan embroidered purse") so suitable judges can be found. If you have specific needs (e.g. access to electricity or an early judging time) please include this request.

If, after making a declaration of intent, a potential competitor is unable to produce one or more of the entries, he/she is expected to inform the current A&S Champion and the A&S officer as soon as possible. (Note: the object does not have to be completely finished to be an acceptable entry.)

A judging schedule will be sent to each entrant at least one week before Silverwolf. The entrants must be available to talk with the judges during their scheduled judging time.

The name of the new A&S Champion will be announced during evening court at Silverwolf.

Any questions about this competition should be directed to the A&S Champion and /or the A&S officer. Questions about the role of the champion may also be directed to the Baron and Baroness.

Here are the <u>requirements to fight in our Coronet</u>. These are in addition to the Laws of Avacal.

- 1) Double elimination tournament
- 2) Standard An Tir shield conventions
- a. Round: 30" Max, measured elbow to elbow
- b. Heater/rectangle: chin to crotch sitting high and shoulder point to shoulder point wide
- c. Oval: do not exceed 707 square inches in total surface area
- 3) No more than three combined striking surfaces
- 4) Madus:

- a. In general these will not be allowed.
- b. IF you have documentation that your persona used such a weapon AND you are making a reasonable attempt to portray said persona upon the field, we may allow such a weapon provided it is built in a realistic manner.
- c. Our word is final, if you have doubts about anything you wish to fight with, get it checked with us PRIOR to Coronet
- 5) Those wishing to enter our list must present themselves with displayed heraldry. This heraldry does not need to be passed with the College of Heralds
