I participated in a discussion on volunteering in the SCA this weekend at QUAD. There are a few highlight points I'd like to share (there was a lot more said and I'd be happy to discuss)

- We have a small negative language issue that we should all work to correct. When someone takes on an officer role or steps up to be an event steward its common to hear "my condolences" and other words to the effect of "what are you stupid?"

I'm sure this negative spin is unintentional but it does have a larger effect. No one wants to feel like a sucker for taking on a role and volunteering their energy - its defeating.

We need to change our language to "congrats!", "that's cool!" and "thank you! you're awesome!"

- We are a team. -->All<-- of us! We all need to support each other in doing the work aspects that need doing to allow everyone to keep having fun. So if you feel you can help someone who looks like they might need a hand offer your help. From taking out trash at events to being an officer.



## Entering the Borealis A&S Championship: Why YOU Should Do It!

My Lords and Ladies,
With the Borealis A&S Championship coming up in three months, it is a suitable time to consider entering.
Hopefully, many of you are already planning to do so.
Perhaps some of you are sitting on the fence about it.

It is to you fence sitters that this letter is addressed.

Let us begin with acknowledging that we can all come up with some good reasons for not entering. It is certainly a year's commitment of service to the Barony, a year in which you are expected to support the Arts and Sciences as much as you are able in conjunction with the A&S Minister and the Baron and Baroness. It means organizing and running the Championship to determine your successor at the end of your term. It means actually making something and documenting it and then, having poured your heart and soul into it, submitting it for judgement. And let's be honest, we've all heard horror stories about being

confronted by \*that\* judge. Or maybe, like me, your anxiety level goes up when faced with Peers looking at your stuff.

All of these are legitimate concerns, so allow me to speak of my experience as a veteran of many A&S competitions and as the Borealis A&S Champion for the past year.

This past year has flown by. There simply has not been enough time to do all the things I envisioned doing with my office. It is with sincere regret that I have to surrender my title and regalia to one of you, who I am certain are more than worthy. If you value the Arts and Sciences, serving as Champion is a labour of love. And certainly I had more than enough support and help from the A&S minister, the Baron and Baroness, my colleagues (the other A&S Champions in the Kingdom) and everyone else who wants to see the Arts and Sciences flourish. I have never at any time felt that this was something I had to do on my own. I was quite overjoyed to discover that I was part of a large group of intelligent, creative, resourceful people who were more than willing to help at any time.

Standing behind Their Excellencies at Court has also been

a gratifying experience. I have had a front row seat to some of the most moving elevations and ceremonies of the past year. Never once was this an onerous task in any way.

But in a way, that's the easy part. What about the actual competition? What about making something, or writing a research paper, something you obviously care a lot about and then putting it out there for judgement? That can, indeed, be a daunting prospect. Or it should be, because if it isn't, you probably aren't all that invested, or your skin is much thicker than mine.

Yes, it can be somewhat nerve-wracking. We have some very knowledgeable people in Avacal who will look at your work with a critical eye. But what an opportunity! When you enter an A&S Championship, you have the undivided attention of three people who are there to talk about your stuff. They are there to explore your geek. Peers are usually so busy, it often proves difficult to get their attention in amongst all their other duties, but here, they're **all yours**.

And while we've all heard horror stories about harsh or critical judges, I can honestly say that I have never encountered a judge that was intentionally mean-spirited. One must enter the competition expecting that the judges will have suggestions about how to improve your work. Oftentimes they have volunteered to judge the entries, so they start from a place of interest and wanting to know more about your process. To not share your creation because you are worried about what the judges \*might\* say is not fair, not to you as an artisan, not to your creation, and not to any of us, who will be ultimately enriched and enlightened by what you bring to the competition.

So, if you are wondering whether or not you should enter the Baronial Arts and Sciences competition, give it some serious consideration. I have personally found that that the inspiration and enrichment to my own process as an artisan has been priceless.

#### Roasted Turnips

This is a slight modification of a recipe for a tart filling. Roasting the turnips helps reduce their bite, which when combined with the cinnamon and sugar results in a very mild, pleasantly flavored dish.

5 medium turnips

1 cup soft cheese, grated

3 eggs

4 Tbsp. butter, melted

1 Tbsp. sugar

1/2 tsp. cinnamon

1/4 tsp. salt

Trim and wash the turnips. Bake in a covered dish (or wrapped in foil) until soft - about an hour at 350°F. Let cool and then peel and cut into small strips. Add cheese and set aside.

Beat eggs, sugar, cinnamon, and salt. Pour over turnips and cheese. Add melted butter and mix well. Put into greased pan and bake at 350°F until set - about 35 minutes.
