COOKING WITH ERNA

Autumn is upon us, once again.

You can almost forget the cold coming, in the warmth of these sunny, clear days; bask in the glow of the colored leaves. Occasionally, though, we get a cool grey day with smatterings of rain and a wind from the north, blowing the bright leaves from the trees.

On a day like this, nothing could be more comforting than a hearty soup & fresh, multi-grain bread slathered with butter "tooth deep" as my grandfather used to say. Without further ado, here is my favorite soup for those days:

Lentils and Barley Soup

Cover a packet of pork neckbones with water.

Add 2 tbsp of dried vegetables, 1 1/2 tbsp salt, some pepper,

about 1/2 tsp each of marjoram,

basil, thyme, and poultry seasoning. Bring to a boil.

Add 1/2 package "soup mix" lentils and barley (sold as a mix - no seasoning) and

1/4 package of pearl barley.

Put the lid on, and turn the heat down as low as you can while maintaining the boil. Boil for 1 or 2 hours. Stir periodically; add water if needed. Remove bones to a plate - when they have cooled a bit, pull the meat off the bones and pop into the soup. NOW discard the bones.

Then add 3 stalks of celery (sliced), 1 onion (coarsely chopped), & the juice of 1/2 lemon.

Taste and add more seasoning if desired.

Once the vegetables are cooked, your soup is done.
