summary (more than two words) about any activities directly related to your office which have taken place since the last report (at this point, since December). Contests? Names of winners? Projects undertaken by people? Activities which you feel should be brought to my attention (good or bad)? Remember - your report is intended to increase MY AWARENESS of what is happening out there - I don't like to guess, and I don't like worthy people going un-recognized.
