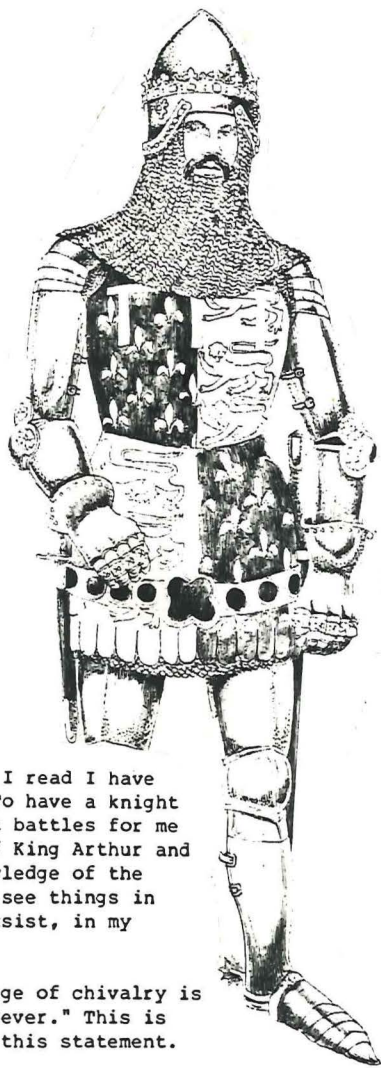

The Chivalric Ideal ::



Ever since I could read and appreciate what I read I have loved the tales of Robin Hood and King Arthur. To have a knight in shining armour sweep me off my feet and fight battles for me was an ideal dream.. I believed in those tales of King Arthur and Robin Hood then and I still do but with more knowledge of the middle ages that lets me see past the stories to see things in a more realistic light. Someone like them did exist, in my opinion.

Edmond Blake in the 18th century said: "The age of chivalry is gone, and the glory of Europe is extinguished forever." This is where the SCA comes in. We are trying to banish this statement.

The chivalric ideal involved a code of honour which combined loyalty honesty, compassion, service and gentleness along with the qualities of fierceness, sternness and raw courage. The knight is a man of blood and iron, a man familiar with the sight of a smashed face, and the ragged stumps of lopped off limbs, he is also a demure, almost maiden-like guest in hall, a gentle, modest, unobtrusive man. He is fierce to the nth and meek to the nth. This must be cultivated with deliberate attention and discipline. Chivalry offers the only possible escape from a world divided between wolves who do not understand and sheep who cannot defend the things which make life desirable.

This last paragraph on chivalry was taken from an article in the Alberta Report, June 10/91. Quotes are from C.S. Lewis and Muriel Whitaker. It describes what I think an ideal knight should be. I hope the ideals the SCA has now will continue and that we take these ideals into mundane life as well.

PRIMY

OAT FARLS (oat cakes)

2 cups rolled oats (not instant)
1 1/4 to 2 1/4 cups buttermilk
2 1/2 cups flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking soda

THE DAY BEFORE SERVING, mix the oats with the
buttermilk. cover with plastic or a plate; and let
stand overnight at room temperature.

Pre-heat oven to 350. Lightly grease a baking
sheet and set aside. Stir together flour, salt and
baking soda. Gradually beat the flour mixture into
the oat mixture to form a soft dough. Add more
buttermilk if necessary. Shape dough into a
flattened circle about 1 inch thick. With a sharp
knife, cut the dough into quarters. Place each
farl, or quarter, on the prepared baking sheet, and
bake for about 40 minutes or until browned.

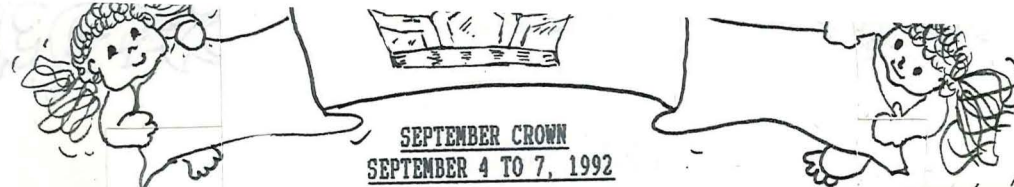
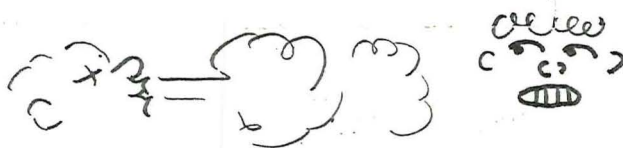

September Crown the Autocrat's report

Copy for September Crown went into the July Crier. Updated information with directions has been sent to the Crier for the August Edition. We have arranged for five Porta-Potties to be on site. With the fourteen flush toilets, this should be sufficient. In case this is not enough, we have arranged that with a phone call, we can have more Porta-Potties in place within an hour. We have arranged with Klondike Valley to have all entrances equipped with chains, so that we can close them off to the general public. The area where vehicles will be parked will also be chained off, with constables on patrol at all times. All gate trolls

and constables will have headsets to keep in touch with each other, the head constable, and the autocrat.

We have made arrangements for media to be allowed on site with very strict rules. These are:

1. They must be in costume (we will provide)
2. They must have a guide with them at all times.
3. They may take pictures only when given permission to do so.

Gary Ruta, manager of Klondike Valley, will be setting up the media. He understands that no information will be released through the media until the event is finished. We will have arranged people whom they may interview.

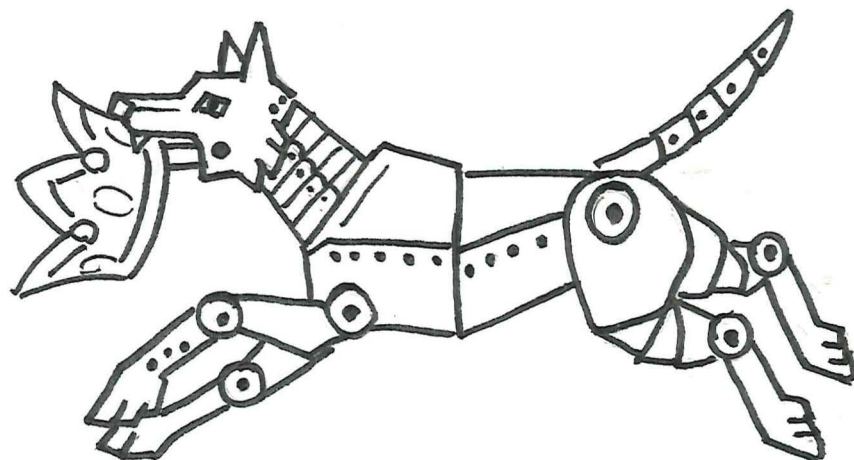
The Lists equipment will be picked up at July Coronation and brought to Edmonton. As of 2 July, 1992, this is the only officer who has made arrangements for equipment.


There are signs being prepared now for all points of entrance to Edmonton as listed on the map. (see Crier copy). We will also have each SCA branch seneschal receiving information on Edmonton, how to get here, and information about Klondike Valley. We are planning to sell T-shirts at Crown celebrating September, 92 Crown in Borealis. The final logo design will be ready by 27 July 1992.

As to our expenses to date; we expect that between mailing, cost of site, photocopying, and printing of T-shirts, our expenses will be \$3200. We have \$1000 in the Crown account, with access to \$2500 from Borealis' Cantons, and with at least one more fundraising event where we expect to raise a minimum of \$300. This gives us access to funds of \$3800, \$600 over our maximum expected expenses.


The site opens at 3:00 pm, Friday the 4th, and closes at 3:00 pm on Monday the 7th.

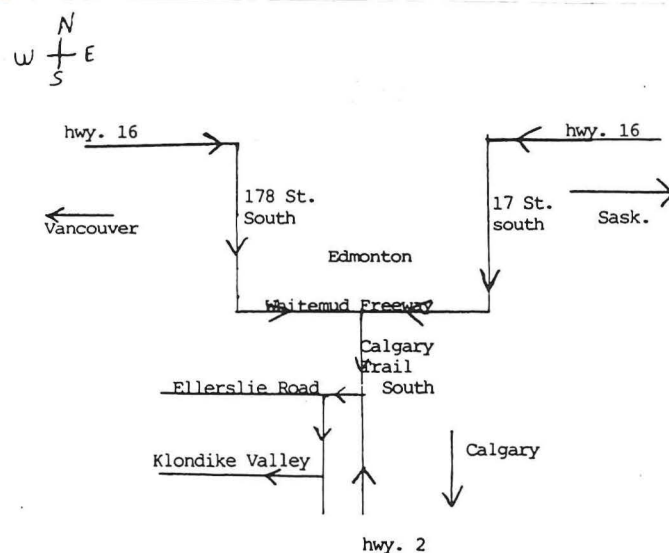


Directions to the site:

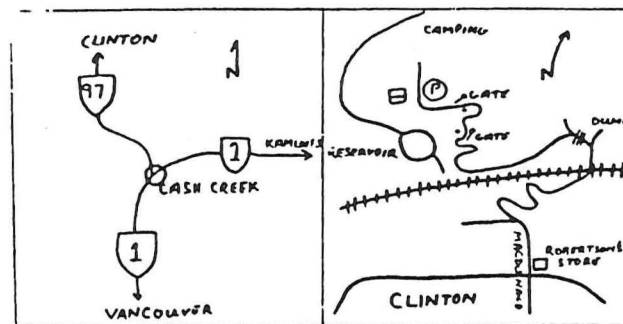


CLINTON WAR.....

Site Fee: a \$12.00 exhibitors pass per person for the fair grounds is good for all three days or a day pass is \$6.00.

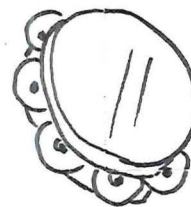
For those camping on the site we have access to a gate for equipment and tents. We are requested to set up our tents before noon or after 10 pm.
