





Dmitri Nikolai Bronslav Borealis, Master of Stables or... If someone is doing slow work, they may want to wear only their helm, or... If some piece of armor is not up to standards and the owner just realized it, depending on the piece of armor, location, experience/maturity of the fighter, and the type of activity he/she will be engage in. It may not be necessary to stop this person from fighting, rather to limit their activity.

The key for all to remember is that we play together and if an individual wants to try and stretch the rules, then the local M.O.S. is there to say NO.

The local M.O.S. is there to ensure the needs of all fighters are being met. If one particular person is fighting in top tourney mode and hurting or wiping out everyone else when they want to practice war or specific shots/techniques, what level of enjoyment is there for those with the bruises? We improve our fighting by making mistakes and learning from them. If practice is not a learning atmosphere, then we learn on the tourney field or war field.

The promotion of learning and practice is very important and I would like to see the local M.O.S's lead the way in facilitating this atmosphere. You can bring in Avacalians [or others] to teach seminars or lead practices. Develop training drill / techniques. Send off to other Branches / Kingdoms for information on how they run their practices. But most of all , you the local M.O.S. are there to lead by example.



FROM THE AVACAL OP EARL MARSHAL

24July, 1993

Greetings, My best wishes for Their Royal Majesties, Sir Rorik Gunnarsson and Helena of Birka for a prosperous and enjoyable reign. I trust all are enjoying the war and tourney season as much as I am.

To be announced:

Weapon and Shield Standards for September Crown: By decree of His Royal Majesty Rorik, the following standards will be enforced during the Crown Lists to be held this September:

- +6 1/2' maximum length for weapons
- +A single weapon is to have no more than 3 attack surfaces
- +No active use of butt spikes[these are to be considered pommel weights]
- +No thrusting tips on both ends of weapons[one must be considered a pommel]
- +Two-stick fighters are limited to 5 attack surfaces
- +No attack surfaces on shields
- +Center-grip shields are to be measured knuckle to knuckle[maximum diameter 30"]
- +Heater shields are to be measured shoulder to shoulder, chin to crotch, while sitting
- +Strapped rounds not to exceed 26" in diameter
- +Both fighter and consort must be able to swear fealty to the Crown

ABC revisions: Anyone wishing to express changes to the ABC. You are welcome to write to Graf Sir Berek von Langental.

Branch Fighting Practices: What is the responsibility of the Branch M.O.S. at your fighting practice?

This topic was suggested to me by a very fine and lovely Lady, who thought it would be prudent for me to express my thoughts on this topic to the populace and the local M.O.S's. Thank you and if anyone else has ideas, please let me know.

Obviously, the main purpose of the M.O.S. is to ensure all rules and regulations are adhered to. However, this must be tempered with humility and understanding. A practice is not the same as a tourney or war, a practice is a controlled environment that is used to experiment and learn.

For example: Armor inspection on a new fighter must be complete, He/She does not have the understanding or experience to ensure all is there and all fits right. A more experienced and mature fighter does not need a complete inspection, but rather a going over to look for broken straps and possibly missed pieces. Try asking if he/she has done any recent repairs.

From the Silverwolf Light Champion:

Greetings unto the populace of Borealis I would like to take this opportunity to state that my year as your light champion has been enjoyable and a valuable learning experience. I have learned how my limits and boundaries as a servant of our baron and of our King can be expanded, as well as how there are no limits as to the value of us in serving the Kingdom.

I would also like to thank those who helped me by providing me with technical and moral support, namely, HL Sjt. Edward Bolden, HL Yeoman Mordecai Salzer, Lord Eldred of Evesham, HL Yeoman Joan the Just and HL Sjt. Cennet ap Llangollen. 



Open letter to all branches in Kingdom of An Tir:

The Barony of Borealis successfully worked with the Alberta Provincial Museum in the spring of 1993, to provide a top notch medieval exhibit, feast, and Demo of crafts and fighting for the general public. Approximately 7,000 people filed through the exhibit (all ages), and 100 people paid \$30.00 to participate in the Medieval Feast (with another 100 on a waiting list!). The museum staff were so impressed by the turn out (there were an average of 300 people per hour in the exhibit, and they were staying for an unheard of average of two hours), that the exhibit, originally scheduled for one week, was extended to two weeks. Needless to say, they want to do it again!

Therefore, I am once again soliciting photos of top quality items, preferably constructed by SCA artisans. Each photo must be accompanied by a BRIEF description of the item, time period, and the mundane name and address of the owner of the object. The items can be anything from your favorite sword to a beautiful piece of needlework or pottery. The exhibit will be done on a similar theme as the previous one; namely, the "fair grounds" room and the "castle interior". Costumes are especially popular. The deadline for photo submission is December 1, 1993. After that date, the museum staff will commence choosing the items they want included in the display.

If your item is chosen, you will be sent a Museum Inventory Form, and instructions regarding how to get your item (accompanied by its form!) to the museum. As soon as it is received by the museum, it is insured and treated as any museum article would be. {While this is very reassuring, I have to admit that it seemed funny to me to watch them tututting over the way we take care of our stuff, and handling everything with cotton gloves. I tried to explain that these are things people USE all the time, but they were still shocked.}

The exhibit will run for THREE weeks next year; March 26 to April 17, 1994. They will also be running the "Grand Fair" again, March 26-27. At this time, the Museum has invited SCA artisans to merchant their wares, in order to add to the "fair" flavour. HOWEVER, please note that the Museum reserves the right to jury the merchants; i.e. you must submit photos of your wares as well as a written description of your work. They are not charging for merchanting, but it is important to them that the wares displayed are truly quality, hand-crafted work. No garage sale re-sales! If you live out of Edmonton, but would like to participate, it may
