presence of municipal authorities. This detailed contract required that the Master teach the apprentice his craft, provide room and board, usually demanded chores in addition to daily work, and made the master responsible for the conduct of the student. Apprentices couldn't even marry without permission of their master.

The Gilds power died with the coming of big industry. The delicate balance between apprentice, journeyman, and master couldn't be maintained in the large factory operation of the Industrial revolution.

The Spirit of the Gild was one of brotherhood; craftsmen were forbidden to use undue influence to secure customers.

Initially, members were simply townspeople who were willing to live in the town and put their skills to work to help the town prosper. After a while, it went by inheritance. There were initiation fees to be paid, which were waived for the eldest son. After that, a complex schedule of fees went into effect. It is interesting to note that a widow of a Gild merchant retained membership until she remarried.

Every occupation that had at least 20 workers in a town formed its own gild. It wasn't long before the gilds established a recognized system for training and recognizing a level of skill and experience. These three grades will be instantly recognized today;

- 1) Master
- 2) Journeyman
- 3) Apprentice

These three levels worked side by side in the workshop. The masters of any craft ruled it thru officials that they appointed. These craft officials were responsible for;

- ordinances
 - fees
 - fines
- benefactions

and were the ultimate authority.

In 1563, the 7-year apprenticeship period, previously a custom, became law. An apprenticeship contract was signed in the

The Gilds (Guilds) submitted by Erna Kajadotter

The gilds came into power as the Feudal system decayed. Impoverished or greedy Lords sold towns their right to govern themselves and to regulate their trades. These two rights became established as the Municipal Government and the Gild Merchant. The two regulatory systems worked together, yet had distinctly separate functions, which were established by Gild Charters. The charters were very complex, and due to the depth of these written documents, Gild history is readily available today.

The Gild Merchant was an organization of merchants which had a trade monopoly in their town, and concerned themselves with the regulation of that monopoly. They possessed property, and were self-governing to a large extent. They made agreements with gilds of neighbouring towns with regards to the free entry of goods. They were responsible for the organization and development of the trade of the town (under the supervision and active control of the town's municipal officers).

In summary, the function of the Gild Merchant was;

- to arrange for & control markets
- fix prices and wages
- arrange for communal purchases
- control trading operations of members and NON-members
- collect tolls
- punish violations of its regulations.

What this amounted to was that a Gild Merchant was an artisan who bought his own raw materials, produced his own wares in his own workshop, and sold direct to his own
