

Seneschal's Message June AS XXVIII

Greetings and Welcome to Spring in Borealis!

There are many things of great importance to pass on to all members of the Society. As many of you will now know, the Board has rescinded the universal "Pay for Play" package, but they have instituted some other changes in it's stead. There will still be a \$10.00 increase in membership fees to all classes of membership. However, Canadians will now qualify for International memberships, which cost \$15.00 US, BUT the DO NOT include a subscription to the Crier. As many of you will know, in order to participate as officers or in high level tournaments, you MUST be receiving the Crier at your place of residence. For International class Family memberships, there will now be a \$40.00 US cap on fees, but again, this does not include a subscription to the Crier.

More importantly, the Board has decreed that all branches of the SCA will now collect a three (\$3.00) dollar surcharge to be paid by all non-members at events. I believe that a suitable form can be supplied for all autocrats to keep track of non-members participating at their event. This surcharge must be sent to the Corporation within 10 days of the event so we will try to have some mechanism in place to make it easier. This surcharge will come into effect as of JUNE 1, 1994, which means Sergeants and Avacal Heavies Championship. Please bring your membership card.

At home, Her Excellency, Baroness Helena, has made it known that she will be officially stepping down at May Crown in Wealdsmere. His Excellency, Sir Rorik, feels that her leaving changes the nature of the agreement between the people and the Baron and Baroness. His Excellency has called for a Vote of Confidence so that he may know if it is the people's will that he remain on as your Baron. Sir Rorik will be seeking a majority of support, 66%, from the eligible voting members of the branch. A suitable date and place for the vote will be decided at the latest, by the next Baronial Meeting.

I wish to remind all officers that reports are due July 1, 1994, with no exceptions. The offices of Baronial Constable and Waterbearer still remain open, please see me or Adelaine for details. The next Baronial meeting is to be held on the Su 'y of Sergeants and will begin at 2 PM. Everyone is welcome.

MINUTES FROM THE SPRING 1994 BOREALIS BARONIAL MEETING SATURDAY, APRIL 23, 1994

Meeting called to order at 10:04 AM

Present: Daryl Mahoney, Lisa Townsend, Heather Solomons, Eric von Starkleberg, Karvin Ma, Dean Schieve, Robert Reader, Maxwell Garrison, Shelley Ann Jensen, Stewart Hiar, Gail Hiar, Melanie Cragien, Karin Thirlwell, Ray Hamel, Shawn Thirlwell, Blaine Blington.

Minutes of the November 1993 read by Lisa. Accepted.

Officers reports

A&S Dean reported on CP A&S; more entries then last year (40+ vs. 29); more entries from Sask. Ithra; A&S classes not as well attended as fighting classes. HRM Jacyntha requesting articles from artisans for Crown Council in May. Spring Faire; no report, so no idea of profit/loss.

Constable-open as of Spring Faire.

Exchequer- no final statement from bank. Silverwolf not cleared up yet, outstanding balance of 24.01. Winter Moose; not cleared up, outstanding documents. New exchequer documents for report of events. Year end report needed by Kingdom (Malcolm). Close outstanding accounts.

Discussion of 10%/10% donations to CP/Kingdom from baronial events. One time annual donation to CP/Kingdom suggested by Karin due to losses; possible loss in future. All events previous to May 1, 1994 will be considered 10%/10% donations.

After May 1, 1994, donations will be looked at based on overall year profit/loss rather then each event. [Due to losses of Winter Moose.] This is to avoid giving away money instead of filling hole(s) due to losses.

Mac- Fighting seminars not well attended. Baronial fight practices on Sunday often not well attended. What should Barony be doing 'fighting-wise'? Veraquilon fight practices often not well attended. Suggestion of questionnaire to find out what direction fighters want to go. (Stewart). Suggestion to go to CP level so Baronial/ Canton-level not always affected-more sharing-more financially possible. Future fighters brought up based on questions of who was knowledgeable/well-known given by Daryl. Herald-Not present due to Silver Arrow tourney, no submission since last quarter. [March 1994]

Chatelaine-Received job description from Kingdom. Kingdom sees Gold Key as Deputy to Chatelaine. Daryl stated Kingdom directives must be followed; Chatelaine's decision as to how much autonomy is given to Gold Key. Description of Library contents, lending out of books often, demos have been done. Fundraising in the way of Casinos (Klondike Days is coming up-England country this year.) Currently working on dance demo and Multiple Sclerosis upcoming event. Chatelaine now Greater office and not deputy of the Seneschal. Fighters handbook can be copied, too with a one dollar donation to the Kingdom (permission from Kingdom Earl Marshall). Problem with Gold Key at Feast of the

do that job to the utmost of his ability, and would no longer be able to act as the king's servant, but either he did not explain this well enough or Henry ignored his protests.

Becket was made Archbishop of Canterbury in 1162.

Thomas resigned the chancellorship and became an ascetic priest, instead of the wild - living courtier. He also fought the King for the right of clergy to be tried only by clerical court.

Becket soon had to flee from the King's wrath, but Pope Alexander, not wanting the conflict to hurt the church, mediated and Becket returned to England.

Back in England, Becket continued to oppose King Henry, excommunicating the Bishops who had performed the coronation of King Henry's son. The coronation of Kings is traditionally done by the Archbishop of Canterbury, but since Becket was out of the country, it was done by the Archbishop of York.

When Henry heard this, he was furious, and in a mad rage he exclaimed "And not one of the cowards I nourish at my table - not one will deliver me from this meddlesome priest".

Four knights took this as an order, and murdered Becket in front of the cathedral altar on December 29, 1170.

King Henry II was forced to do public penance - the first and only royalty ever to do so.

Becket was canonized in 1173.

Clerics continued to be tried before clerical courts. Since anyone who could read and write was presumed to have some connection with the church, it sufficed to be able to read a verse of the Bible to escape the death penalty for murder -it was called "benefit of clergy".

INTERESTING PEOPLE OF THE MIDDLE AGES by Rowena of Tregalles

SAINT THOMAS a BECKET (1118-1170)

Thomas Becket is one of the more complex and colourful people of the middle ages, and his story is worthy of a classic epic.

He was the protege of the Archbishop of Canterbury, Theobald, and, as such, was given a good education, but was not noted for scholarship. What was most remarkable about the man was his engaging personality and the ability to make himself liked by all around him. He also took the point of view -which eventually became Henry's downfall - that whatever job he took, he would do it to the utmost of his ability.

Under King Stephen, Theobald was able to gain many concessions for the church, including the right of clergy to only be tried by a clerical court -where the stiffest penalty was to be stripped of church statusinstead of the lay courts, where the penalties were much harsher.

Theobald was a key force in the settlement which resulted in Henry II succeeding Stephen as king, and as a result became one of Henry's closest advisors. He was getting old, however, and decided he wanted a loyal servant in the position to help him against a new stubborn young king for the rights of the church. He urged Henry to appoint Becket to the post of chancellor, which would make him second only to the king. This was duly accomplished and Becket became a close friend to the king, advising him, performing his duties with skill and efficiency. To Theobald's surprise, however, he also took the king's side in the matter of legal equality and he fought for uniform justice, lay or clerical.

In 1161, Theobald died and Henry used the same logic as Theobald - he decided he wanted a loyal servant in an important post to support his will.

Becket resisted; as Archbishop he would

Membership hike is still on. \$10.00 dollar increase on next renewal.

Silverwolf 1993- done

Silverwolf 1994 - date reserved Sept. 17, now on CP calender (same with St. Nicks.), bids will be accepted until May 14, St. Nicholas permanently held in Veraquilon (officially a canton event).

Winter War 1994- Total profit 213.04. For next year something must be done to improve archer's play-time. Bids for 1995 until September 17, Silverwolf.

Provincial Museum- Museum very happy. \$1300 total donation, 12,000 people through the display, workshops a large success, feast well attended. Discussion for next year: how to bring in other branches. [Sask., Vancouver, CP] Museum is talking about taking a more proactive role- saying what they want rather then getting what they get. Merchants on Sunday 2 of 8 made appearance. Donation of money to groups of participation, proposal to donate \$150 each to Montengarde and Bitterend because of large involvement. (\$300 bonus was given by Museum.) The money will be given as a 'thank you' donation, rather then setting a precedent for future museum demos of a percentage share for participation.

Sc. yeart/Yeoman. Eckville a neutral site **d**ue to problems of miscommunication. (Dean).

Labeland will be holding a Medieval fair on Aug 27/28 - see Stewart, more info pending.




Greetings from the Sergeants of the Barony of Borealis,
