Minutes of the Saturday, December 7, 1996 Borealis Baronial meeting held at Yule Feast in Caernarvon Hall, Canton of Veraquilon. Called to order at 5:09 p.m.

Minutes of the September 21, 1996 meeting read by Morecai Salzer. Sgt. Cennet ap Llangollen advised that in the Provost's report the number of schlager blades to be purchased for each canton is two not one. Minutes accepted as amended.

Attendance: Alys Sylfireloc of Aelesmera, Cailleach Aine, Marcus Wynniatt, Mordecai Salzer, Eadwulf de Ruthven, Joan the Just, Valgard af Hus Vendrer, Kirsten Macbheath, John Macleod the Black, Aethelestan of Carlisle, Alphonse de Lorraine, Freydis the Far-Travelled, Cennet ap Llangollen, Gawaine, Dirk, His Excellency Baron Alfheim.

Chair: Gwyneath O Coedaneu Secretary: Dagmar af Hjörriing

Officer's Reports

Seneschal: no report

Exchequer: Balance in the Baronial account approximately \$4,500.00. Need final financial reports on Silverwolf and Coronet. Also needs input from the Cantons for Society's Branch financial statements.

Herald: Has been elevated to Principality level. Has some applications for Canton of Veraquilon herald. Would like to see someone in the position who hasn't held an office before. His Excellency reported that the Canton of Stone-wolf will be appointing a new herald.

Master of Stables: Not Present. His Excellency reported the number of fighters is dwindling in all disciplines. Need to actively recruit. Can't currently field a Baronial army. Comments - Alphonse de Lorraine reports that Veraquilon has several new people getting armour together. Valgard af Hus Vendrer says that war archery seems to be discouraged, but the Baron said that is definitely contrary to official policy.

Arts and Sciences: Trying to choose classes for Ithra. fax questionnaire to Stonewolf

Provost: Cantons will purchase two schlagers each with masks if the Barony can match funds (\$300.00 each from Veraquilon and Stonewolf, \$600.00 from Borealis). These will be training aids for Kingdom level fencing. Comments - Joan the Just suggested renting then to recoup the costs. Eadwulf de Ruthven noted that the change in archery style may affect the equipment requirement. (It was stressed that the purchased blades are for training aids before people invest their own money; not a subsidy from the group.) Freydis the Far-Travelled mentioned that the blades must be made available regularly (this is the job of the Provost) and the users should help raise funds to cover the costs.

LEMON LOAF

This simple and delicious cake was served as dessert at the Spring Fair Last Year. This recipe is my Granny's and it never fails.

Ingredients:

1 cup white sugar
1/2 cup shortening (I used butter)
2 eggs well beaten
1/2 cup milk
1 lemon rind, finely grated

1 1/2 cups all purpose flour sifted
1/2 tsp salt
1 tsp Baking powder

1/4 cup sugar and juice of one lemon

a well greased 9x5 loaf pan

In a large bowl cream the shortening and add the sugar. When mixed together well add the eggs, milk and the lemon rind. In another bowl, sift together the dry ingredients then add to the first mixture. Blend together until all moistened. Pour into the loaf pan and bake in a 350°f oven for approximately an hour.

While the loaf is baking combine the 1/4 cup of sugar with the lemon juice and stir until the sugar dissolves.

Let the cake stand for a few minutes before pouring the sweetened lemon juice over the hot loaf.

Let the loaf cool in the pan then turn it out and enjoy a nice fat slice.

This recipe makes one loaf that keeps well in the freezer.
(if it gets that far!!!)

The former Canton of Bordergate would like to put forward a bid for June 1997 Coronet under the Baronial name. They only have about six members, so they would need Baronial Members to assist at the event. The consensus was that we would support them if they can produce a strong bid. More Regalia is needed especially for the various champions. The Baronial Champions's awards need names. Suggestions will be taken until the Feast of the Evergreens.

Old Business

The Seneschal advised that Baronial Censuses are still being accepted.

New Business

Cailleach: The organizers of the Strathcona County Medieval Days (May 28 to June 1) need advisors in medieval demos and helpers for the Thursday mayor's luncheon. She will provide copy for the Aurora.

Eadwulf: Would like to set up a Baronial resource list of people and the books and other things they would be willing to lend out.

Next Meeting: The first weekend of February in 1997 at the Feast of the Evergreens when the baronial fencing championship will be held.

Meeting adjourned at 6:09 p.m.





Lord Marcus Wynniatt, Gallant of Borealis



In the spring of 1831 a storm carried away a portion of sandbank on the west coast of Lewis and exposed a number of small carved ivory chessmen. These wonderfully vital figures are worked in walrus tusk and some would have been left natural and some stained dark red, although this has now faded to palest pink. Although the carving is remarkably detailed, with every piece different, the tallest of these sturdy chess pieces is only 10 cm high. There is much debate about the origins of these chessmen, but the intricate carving on the backs of the thrones of some of the figures can be compared with a group of Scandinavian carvings of the twelfth century. How the pieces came to the remote Outer Hebrides remains a mystery, but it's possible they were washed ashore from a lost merchant's ship, and buried in the sand dunes for many hundreds of years. Seventy eight of the chessmen are now distributed between the British Museum in London and the Royal Museum of Scotland in Edinburgh.



Recommended: The placement of a French knot in the centre of each eye on both figures. Use the same colour as for backstitching.
