

ARTS & SCIENCES PENTATHLON & TRIATHLON (AS XXXI)

To be pentathlon champion you must enter at least five categories. Entries must be in both arts and sciences.

To enter in the Novice Championship you cannot have won before in the categories entered or have been an Arts & Sciences Novice or Pentathlon Champion.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. All entries must be within the time period 500-1650CE and be of European culture or a culture which had contact with Europe at that time.
- 2. All entries must be accompanied by documentation. Minimum documentation should consist of an explanation of what the piece is and what time period it is from.
- 3. Individuals may enter as many or as few categories as they wish, with a maximum of three entries per category.
- 4. Competitors must have entries in five separate categories in order to be eligible for overall Pentathlon winner, but prizes in individual categories may be awarded to contestants with fewer entries.
- 5. Individual entries may be submitted in more than one category. Separate documentation must be submitted for each category.
- Each entry will be given a point score out of 25. Judging is based on Documentation, Authenticity, Complexity, Workmanship, Originality and Overall Impression.
- Only the contestant's top five scores, from five separate categories, will be totaled to determine the Pentathlon Champion.
- 8. Only the contestant's top three scores, from three separate categories, will be totaled to determine the Novice Champion.
- 9. There will be no minimum number of entries necessary in order to keep a category open but the judges reserve the right to withhold prizes in any category where no entries receive higher than a predetermined point score.
- 10. Entries must have been completed within the last 18 months. Pieces entered in last year's Pentathlon are not eligible for competition.


