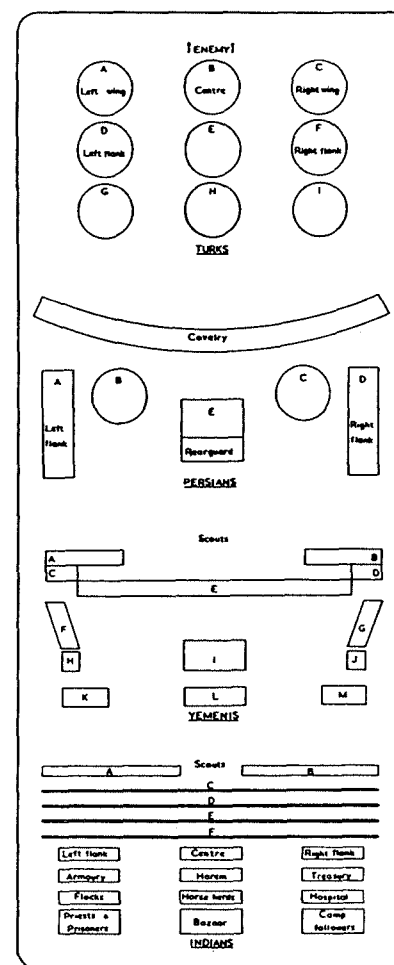

Various orders of battle were traditionally associated with different peoples in Islam. Some were out of date by the time they appeared in surviving manuscripts, but these probably reflected previous military practice. The four schematic battle-arrays shown above are based upon plans in an early 15th-century Persian manuscript written in Muslim India by a certain Fakhr-i Mudabbir. Top to bottom:
Battle array of the Turks (early tribe, not a raiding party)
(A) Cavalry and infantry (B) Leader, advisers and armoury (C) Cavalry and infantry (D) Defensive cavalry and infantry (E) Artificers, harem and herds (F) Offensive cavalry (G) Spare horses with defensive cavalry and infantry (H) Hostages with cavalry escort (I) Infantry with cavalry escort.
Persian battle array
(A) Cavalry, spare horses and cattle (B) Chief Minister and armoury (C) Leader, harem and treasury (D) Infantry with prisoners (E) Infantry with baggage and hospital.
Yemeni (pre-Islamic) battle array
(A) Left front line (B) Right front line (C) Left wing (D) Right wing (E) Centre with leader, chief minister and advisers (F) Left flank (G) Right flank (H) Cavalry (I) Harem, treasury and armoury (J) Cavalry (K) Herds and baggage (L) Banner (M) Invalids with infantry escort.
Indian battle array
(A) Left advance guard (B) Right advance guard (C) Infantry archers with shields (D) Shock troops (E) Armoured elephants and sword-armed infantry (F) Spear-armed cavalry with horse-armour.

Weapons: (Continued)

5. Spears:

- a. Spears shall not have any cutting or smashing head.
- b. Shafts shall be of rattan (or equivalent material) of no less than 1 1/4" (33 mm) in diameter.
- c. Thrusting tips shall be no less than 2" (51 mm) in diameter or cross-section, and shall provide progressively resistant "give" under pressure without allowing contact with the rigid tip of the weapon. Further, it shall not be possible to force the thrusting tip more than 1/2" (12.5 mm) into a legal face guard.

6. Shields:

- a. If a shield is to be used as a weapon, particular attention must be given to keeping it light enough that it will not injure someone who is struck with it.

THE GAMES WE PLAY

FOX IN THE HOLE (OUTDOOR CHASE GAME)

Players armed with a handkerchief attempt to hit the fox, who must hop on one foot. If a player is hit by the fox, he must race for the den (a point some short distance away) with all the other players in hot pursuit. He becomes the fox for the next game.

JUE DE BOULES (France, 13th C - outdoor bowling game, 2 - 6 players)

Forerunner to lawn bowling. Played by two teams, each consisting of 1, 2 or 3 players. If one player, he throws 4 balls; if 2 players, 3 balls each; if three players, 2 balls each.

First throw is by coin toss. Winner throws small white "jack" ball to any distance between 15 and 25 paces. From the same point, he throws the first ball for his team. The second team now throws until they place a ball closer to the jack; hit the jack and move it closer to one of their balls; or run out of balls to throw. If the second team succeeds in any of these, the first team then throws until they are closer to the jack, etc.

Once all balls have been thrown, all balls closer to the jack than the closest ball of the opposing team count 1 point each. Game is to 13 points. Balls can be thrown or rolled in any manner. If the jack is thrown to less than 15 or more than 25 paces, it is returned and the other team throws it instead.

The Shire of Seagirt is proud to host the Annual Fall Kingdom Rapier Academy this year. This year the Academy will be held in conjunction with the Seagrit Fall Ithra, and under the Auspices of the University of Ithra.

All Academy classes will confer Ithra credit to the student and instructors. This means that all instructors must submit Ithra Instructor Application forms to the Seagrit Ithra Registrar as soon as possible.

Please do not be daunted by the Straits. Those travelling to Insula Magna (the Great Isle; at least we think so) can arrange for pick up from any of three ferry quays (The BC Ferry Terminal at Schwartz Bay, The Washington State Ferry at Sidney or the Blackball Ferry Terminal in the inner harbour) for a minimal fee and save \$50 or more for transporting your vehicle.
